

» HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF THESE STUDIES

1. What is an Interactive Bible Study?

Interactive Bible Studies are a bit like a guided tour of a famous city. They take you through a particular part of the Bible, helping you to know where to start, pointing out things along the way, suggesting avenues for further exploration, and making sure that you know how to get home. Like any good tour, the real purpose is to allow you to go exploring for yourself—to dive in, have a good look around, and discover for yourself the riches that God's word has in store.

In other words, these studies aim to provide stimulation and input and point you in the right direction, while leaving you to do plenty of the exploration and discovery yourself.

We hope that these studies will stimulate lots of 'interaction'—interaction with the Bible, with the things we've written, with your own current thoughts and attitudes, with other people as you discuss them, and with God as you talk to him about it all.

2. The format

The studies contain four main components:

- sections of text that introduce, inform, summarize and challenge
- numbered questions that help you examine the passage and think through its meaning
- 'Implications' sections that help you think about what this passage means for you and your life today
- suggestions for thanksgiving and prayer as you close.

3. How to use these studies on your own

- Before you begin, pray that God would open your eyes to what he is saying in the Bible, and give you the spiritual strength to do something about it.
- Work through the study, reading the text, answering the questions about the Bible passage, and exploring things in more detail as you have time.
- Resist the temptation to skip over the 'Implications' and 'Give thanks and pray' sections at the end. It is important that we not only hear and understand God's word, but also respond to it. These closing sections help us do that.
- Take what opportunities you can to talk to others about what you've learnt.

4. How to use these studies in a small group

• Much of the above applies to group study as well. The studies are suitable for structured Bible study or cell groups, as well as for more informal pairs and triplets. Get together with a friend or friends and work through them at your own pace; use them as the basis for regular Bible study with your spouse. You don't need the formal structure of a 'group' to gain maximum benefit.

- For small groups, it is very useful if group members can
 work through the study themselves before the group
 meets. The group discussion can take place comfortably
 in an hour (depending on how sidetracked you get!)
 if all the members have done some work in advance.
- The role of the group leader is to direct the course of the discussion and to try to draw the threads together at the end. If you are a group leader, the material in the appendix 'Tips for leaders' will help you think through how to use these studies in a group setting.
- If your group members usually don't work through the study in advance, it's extra important that the leader prepares which parts to concentrate on, and which parts to glide past more quickly. In particular, the leader will need to select which of the 'Implications' to focus on.
- We haven't included an 'answer guide' to the questions in the studies. This is a deliberate move. We want to give you a guided tour of the Bible, not a lecture. There is more than enough in the text we have written and the questions we have asked to point you in what we think is the right direction. The rest is up to you.

5. Bible translation

Previous editions of this Interactive Bible Study have assumed that most readers would be using the New International Version of the Bible. However, since the release of the English Standard Version in 2001, many have switched to the ESV for study purposes. So with this new edition of *Full of Promise*, we have decided to quote from and refer to the ESV text, which we recommend.

» STUDY 1

WHEN GOOD Turns bad

[GENESIS 1-11]

The big picture

JIGSAW PUZZLES ARE GREAT FUN. At least that's what people keep telling me. Personally, I find them hard work. Sitting at a table surrounded by hundreds of little pieces of coloured cardboard only confuses and frustrates me.

The way I feel about jigsaw puzzles is the way many of us feel about the Old Testament. We may know lots of individual stories of the Old Testament, like Daniel in the lion's den or David and Goliath, but we're not really sure how they all fit together. In fact, some of us may not even know that they do fit together! The end result is that the Old Testament can be a confusing and frustrating part of the Bible, which we either avoid altogether or dip into at random like a phone book or a dictionary.

The aim of these studies is to take some of the confusion out of the Old Testament by providing an overview of its main themes and events. The studies will be like taking a scenic flight over a spectacular but varied landscape. From the plane we'll be able to see the main points of interest—but naturally, we won't have the time to land and study many things in detail.

By the time our flight is over, however, we will have gained an appreciation of the overall landscape, and how it all fits together. That's a particularly important thing to do with the Old Testament, because the events of this part of the Bible prepare us for the greatest event in the history of this planet: the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The big question is: where do we start? There are so many different people, places and events. Which should we look at first? Well, believe it or not, when it comes to the Old Testament, the best place to start is at the beginning.

Read Genesis 1:1-2:3.

First he separates all the different compartments of creation, and then he methodically fills each compartment with appropriate things. For example, first the land and water are separated, and then the water is filled with sea creatures and the land is filled with vegetation and animals.

Genesis reveals a creator who has a place for everything, and who puts

Within God's design for creation, humanity has a central role. Man is created to be God's representative on earth, placed here to enjoy fellowship with God and care for his creation. In this respect, God's creative work culminates in the 'rest' of the seventh day. The seventh day is a picture of God and humanity enjoying perfect rest together in an unspoiled world.

Read Genesis 3.

5. Genesis 3 records the rebellion of Adam and Eve against God's rule. This is often called 'the Fall'. How is the Fall typical of all sin (3:1-7)?

6. In Genesis 3:8-24, God punishes Adam and Eve for their rebellion. Things have changed. How is the created order now different?

A bad decision

As the story of Genesis unfolds, God's good creation is tainted by sin. In Genesis 3, Adam and Eve take life into their own hands and, instead of following God's good instructions, they make up their own rules and decide to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. This rebellious act immediately introduces tension, mistrust, and antagonism into all levels of what was a good creation.

Mankind is now engaged in a struggle with nature. Man and woman are now engaged in a struggle with each other. Even at one of humanity's most beautiful and treasured moments—the birth of a child—there is now pain and anguish. All because humans thought they knew better than God.

And the bad news is only just beginning.

Skim read Genesis 4-11.

7. Note the main events of chapters 4–11. How do they demonstrate the spread of sin and the worsening of creation?

8. Despite all the bad things that happen in these chapters, what evidence is there of God still actively blessing his creation?

The spread of sin

WE'RE ONLY 11 CHAPTERS INTO THE Old Testament but already things seem to be going from bad to worse. Things started out so well: God, mankind and nature were in harmony within a good creation. But before long the whole world unravels into murder, incest, violence, deceit and corruption. Indeed, by the time you reach the end of chapter 11, you'd be excused for wondering why God bothers!

Despite this escalation of sin and evil in the world, there are still signs that God is at work blessing his creation and trying to rectify things. For example, even in the midst of judging sin by means of the flood, God graciously rescues one man and his family. God even blesses Noah with words very similar to those he spoke to Adam and Eve (Gen 9:1-3). What we are seeing is God's unwavering commitment to his creation. Even when mankind is repeatedly unfaithful, God keeps faithfully working to reverse the effects of the Fall.

This is an exciting discovery about God for, as we will see, it leads us straight to Jesus Christ.


(Choose one or more of the following to think about further or to discuss in your group.)

- Give thanks for Jesus, the Word, through whom all things were made.

»TIPS FOR LEADERS

Studying the Old Testament

MOST PEOPLE, IF THEY USE the Old Testament at all, treat it like a phonebook or a dictionary—a proof text here, a half-remembered verse there, and the occasional riveting yarn about Noah or Samson or King David thrown in for good measure. But how does it all fit together?

The first step to appreciating the Old Testament is to understand that it contains a single unified story. It is the unfolding story of God's commitment to his promises to bless the world through the descendants of Abraham. The Old Testament is full of promise—and the promise is ultimately fulfilled in Jesus Christ.

Like any other piece of unified literature, the whole Old Testament therefore needs to be read in such a way that recurring themes and patterns are noticed and appreciated. That's what we hope to achieve through these studies. Large slabs of the Old Testament are dealt with so as to draw out the key themes and ideas. Indeed, this is a good way to read any part of the Bible. For example, to truly appreciate each of the Gospels or any of the apostle Paul's letters, they are best read in one sitting. Approaching the Bible in this way helps us to see the 'big picture'.

Dipping into the Old Testament without understanding the big picture can lead to all sorts of problems. We end up with a fragmented understanding of the Old Testament and we never come to grips with the idea that from the beginning of Genesis to the end of Nehemiah—the last stage in the account of Israel's history—it's a story that's going somewhere. As Christians, we especially need to be always ready to jump into the storyline and follow it through to the logical destination—fulfilment in the life, death, resurrection, ascension and kingly rule of Jesus Christ.

Because these studies are designed to highlight the overarching storyline (or framework) of the Old Testament, that means certain issues and events are not even mentioned. Try to avoid the temptation to add bits that you feel should have been included—we've worked hard to slim things down to a manageable outline. And if your group can catch hold of the framework now, you'll find that detailed study of parts of the Old Testament later on will be much easier. Knowing where things fit in the big picture is a huge help in making sense of the Bible. So for now, be content with our 'aerial view', and don't be tempted to get any closer!

Even with our best efforts to make the studies containable, they're still a little more detailed than we would have liked. These studies will work best if your group prepares during the week. Not preparing ahead will mean that the group is very unlikely to be able to complete a study in a single session.

Getting a hold on the sweep of the Old Testament story is exciting. You'll marvel at the way the plot-line fits together. You'll groan at the constant failings of Israel. And most of all, you'll be thrilled at the way all the promises of God find their fulfilment in Christ.
