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The unlearn Workshop is built on the following framework:

Activate: Experiential Learning Activities - Engage participants through an exploration into their own preconceived biases.

In the front matter of our workshops, we unpack a wide variety of topics using experiential learning activities and media (video, music, art/ design, technology, articles, etc) to create the environment for learning.

Engage: Gallery Walk - We use design to create a dialogue around human rights, social justice, and equity issues.

Our goal is to challenge educators to think critically about their unconscious biases and examine how they can be reinforced by the media, their experiences and their relationships. The Gallery Walk sparks inquiry, increases engagement and raises critical thinking among educators.

Discuss: Facilitation & Dialogue - Share ideas without being "wrong".

In unpacking the educator's reflections, we equip them to develop Culturally Responsive and Relevant Pedagogy (CRRP) skills to en sure that their classrooms reflect the needs and realities of their students.

Outcomes:

- Strengthen Culturally Responsive and Relevant Pedagogy (CRRP).
- Implement teaching practices that reflect the needs of all students.
- Identify and eliminate discriminatory practices.
- Empower educators to facilitate equity, diversity and inclusion discussions.
- Provide insight into our unconscious biases.
- Grow positive safe school cultures.
- Encourage inquiry-based learning connected to real-world settings.
