A FLORIST'S WEDDING Being a florist, I had a specific floral direction in mind. I went with my favourite colours of blush, maroon and navy. Elisha assisted in conditioning the florals the day before, while I focused on creating the bouquets and table centrepieces.

INDUSTRIAL THEME We kept our table arrangements minimal and Westernised in style, with long tables in two long rows alongside the aisle. These complemented the industrial facade of the venue. The chandeliers among the exposed black iron beams were also a perfect juxtaposition of industrial with a hint of luxe femininity – which inspired the look of our wedding.

ALL IN A DAY We did not have the traditional gatecrashing as we wanted Elisha's first look at me in the gown to be at the venue itself. That first look turned out to be the most memorable part of the day as we could enjoy the quiet moment before the hustle and bustle began.
